

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Consortium for Infant and Child Health (CINCH)

was established in 1993 with little more than 30 members, a grant from the Centers for Disease Control, and a mission to improve immunization rates for children in Norfolk. (Fun fact: CINCH was originally called the Consortium for the Immunization of Norfolk's Children!) Since these modest beginnings, CINCH gradually expanded its focus to include the entire Hampton Roads region, has grown to include over 250 community partners, and continues to evolve to meet the needs of the Hampton Roads community.

Over time, CINCH, like many organizations, has periodically engaged in reenvisioning and strategic planning processes. This process is essential to assess where we've been and where we're going, what is working and what is not. Many things in our community have changed over the last few years, impacted greatly by the COVID-19 pandemic, and CINCH continues to be committed to adapting and evolving alongside the Hampton Roads community.

In September 2022, CINCH launched its most recent strategic planning process. We solicited feedback from partners through listening sessions and anonymous surveys, reviewed health needs assessment data, and evaluated strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT analysis). This information was crucial to setting a new path forward for CINCH. Several CINCH partners came together to form a diverse Leadership Team that would guide the strategic planning process. The leadership team met regularly between October 2022 and May 2023, discussing and deliberating to create a new blueprint for the future of CINCH. Mission, vision, values, guiding principles, key pillars, and priority areas were thoughtfully developed and overall structure and framework of CINCH reimagined. At the culmination of this work, the recommendations of the Leadership Team were presented to and approved by the full CINCH coalition.

This document sets the course for the future of CINCH as we collaborate, engage, and take action for child health in Eastern Virginia. With your help, we believe we can move the needle toward optimal health and safety for all children.




BREAKDOWN of CINCH

Transparency


We believe in open and honest communication with all partners, sharing both successes and lessons learned and fostering open utilization of resources.

Our framework establishes the key landmarks we promise to stick to every year to keep things running smoothly. It's our trusty guide to make sure we're always moving forward and staying on track.




HOW THE WORK OF CINCH WILL BE CARRIED OUT

KEY PILLARS




Convene
